





## Policy recommendations identified through Arapahoe Co. water study

LITTLETON — As the Arapahoe County Water Supply Study enters its final stages, policy recommendations have been identified that, if implemented, will ensure the county has a sustainable water supply for future demand.

Residents can learn more about the recommendations and offer feedback at an open house from 5 to 7 p.m., Thursday, May 9, at Kelver Library, 585 S. Main St., Byers.

The study is projecting the county's population will grow to between 900,000 to 960,000 from roughly 655,000 by 2050. The study's proposals include closing potential gaps between future supply and demand, improving water use efficiency and conservation, and extending the life of Denver Basin aquifers to sustain a longterm supply.

The recommendations include:

- coordinating with developers and water providers to identify opportunities to consolidate fewer, larger wells;
- requiring a water supply plan ments will be provided.

- documenting an appropriate supply of water to serve a proposed development;
- · reviewing and updating regulations to identify opportunities to promote or require greater water efficiency in new development. The changes would include updates to building and plumbing codes to require low-flow fixtures and water conservation measures such as water-wise landscaping; and
- encouraging a countywide transition from non-native, water-intensive landscaping to water-wise landscaping that aligns with the current landscaping standards for the county. This adjustment will occur through education and support programs exploring water use efficiencies and possible reclamation and reuse opportunities.


Chicken salad is one of those meals you don't have to cook; it is assembled. The salad will last up to 4 days in an airtight container.
