Gun-free law: Armed teachers exempt

BYERS — When Arapahoe County Public Health rolled out its Health Supply Kiosk pilot program earlier this year, one of the first six locations where the booths were installed was in eastern unincorporated Arapahoe County.

On May 14, Harm Reduction Program Health Educators Elicia Chacon and Nikki Wellander visited Kelver Library in Byers to install one of the new health supply cupboards, which will be stocked with overdose antidotes and test strips to address opioid overdoses, COVID-19 tests, sexual health supplies, and health information

pamphlets.

healthy by bringing the resources to the people and doing it free of charge," said Chacon, noting the kiosk program is currently funded by a combination of grants and opioid settlement funds. "It's all about increasing the availability to people who need the supplies and might be struggling to find them or can't afford them."

The kiosks are stocked with two forms of opioid overdose treatments — the nose-spray form Narcan and the injectable naloxone; test strips for fentanyl and xylazine; and condoms restock the kiosks on a monthly basis but that and lubricant.

if someone finds themselves in a health crisis "It's about keeping the community safe and or someone else is in trouble," Chacon added. "It's all about helping protect residents' health and safety as much as possible."

In addressing why the kiosks also will be supplied with condoms and lubricant, Chacon said it's in response to recent increases in the rate of sexually transmitted diseases.

"Again, a matter of making the most materials available to help keep people protected and without a lot of cost," she said.

Chacon added that plans are to personally





As of the middle of last week, Deer Trail School District had received all three modular class-rooms to accommodate fourth through sixth grades for the upcoming 2024-25 school year. Both sections of the second and third units were delivered June 5, two days after the school board's regular meeting; however, Superintendent Mike Jobman told directors he is confident that all three new units will be ready for students come the first day of school, which is Aug. 12. Original plans were to have the new additions ready for teachers to set up by July 15. All three units were donated by the Cherry Creek School District. The lower floor of the classroom wing of the 5-year-old school will now accommodate preschool through third grades. All elementary grade levels have grown to consist of two classes each.

Workers with Myers & Sons Construction worked diligently last week to pour the two concrete "walls" to support and prevent water erosion under the new County Road 2/15th Avenue low-water crossing at Bijou Creek between Strasburg and Byers. Over previous weeks, approximately 6,000 yards, or almost 13.2 million pounds, of sand was removed. Pouring of the 36-foot-wide by almost 835-foot-long concrete slab to replace the old crossing is expected to commence this week. About 900 cubic-yards of concrete are being used. 

New website tools illustrate ArapCo's funding challenges

ty has unveiled new website exeres in the months ahead.

Commissioners are asking residents to consider the reduction or elimination of many essential services or to consider other alternative funding sources to sustain these services. Last month, the county launched www.acbudget. com to highlight the challenges and propose solutions.

Website exercises are designed to mimic the county's budget process and give users a small monthly budget to allocate to county services, such as safety net programs, law enforcement, and road projects.

A calculator keeps track of which items are funded and any remaining balance.

The hypothetical monthly budgets are based on what a sales tax or property tax adjustment could generate if approved by voters.

"This is a streamlined version of the decisions our elected officials and leadership make each year during the budget cycle," said Commissioner Carrie Warren-Gully, board chair. "The exercises help residents understand how budget decisions affect not only individual departments but the entire county as well. It demonstrates how even small adjustments can make or break critical programs that residents need and demand."

A new calculator tool allows property owners to see how much of their property tax would go toward funding essential services if property taxes were returned pre-TABOR levels. For example, a home valued at \$420,000 would generate \$10.82 per month to



PUBLIC NOTICE

SCHOOL DISTRICT RECORDS

The East Central BOCES Member School Districts keep records on each student to use in the instruction and guidance of each student. The records contain information about the student and his/her education, including attendance, achievement, aptitude, description, assessment and progress. Parents of students under 18 and eligible students have the right to review these records.

Student records are kept in the school building the student attends. If records are not kept in the school the student attends, this will be noted by the person in charge of records in the building. The principal is responsible for maintenance of student records in each building.

To review a student's records, the parent(s) of students under 18 or the eligible student should contact the records custodian. The records will be shown to you as soon as possible and in no case more than three days after the request. If you desire a copy of the educational record, a charge of 10 cents per copy may be charged, unless this fee prohibits your access. The records will be explained to you at your request.

Parents of eligible students may question the content of the records. Any other access to student records will only be allowed if written consent is obtained, upon court order or by any legally issued subpoena.

Student records are reviewed and inappropriate material removed periodically. Those records not of permanent importance must be destroyed at the parents request after graduation or when the student stops attending permanently. Parents of students with disabilities or eligible students will be notified before any personally identifiable information is removed from a record and destroyed. A record of those persons reviewing the records will be kept by the records custodian and can be reviewed by the parent or eligible student.

A school official may release directory type information to the public. To prevent the public release of such information, a parent or eligible student must file a written objection with the records custodian within ten days after receiving this notice. For more detailed information about records, procedures and policies or to file a complaint, contact the local school district administrator, the East Central BOCES Executive Director or the Special Education Director. Letters may be addressed to: Jason Westfall, Executive Director, East Central BOCES, P. O. Box 910, Limon, CO 80828. Unresolved complaints can be appealed using the established appeals process.

Development of a Short-Trip Tool-

BRIGHTON - Adams County implementation blueprint, and will evaluate various short-trip solutions, such as shared electric micro mobility fleets and micro transit. Decision-makers will receive tailored options considering factors such as population density, land use and transportation demand. The toolbox will include use cases, implementation guidance, cost expectations, and procurement steps for each solution.

Short-Trip Needs Assessment: The project will conduct a thorough assessment to identify the community's short-trip needs. The assessment will strive to provide a holistic understanding of the transportation requirements in unincorporated Adams County.

Implementation plan: The project will develop three types of implementation recommendations:

 Integration recommendations to suggest process improvements with electric shared fleets in Adams County's multimodal studies and capital projects.

 Given that areas of unincorporated Adams County are often surrounded by jurisdictions with existing shared fleet programs, recommendations are needed for collaboration with neighboring areas to leverage the programs effectively.



WATKINS — Election Commission members are drawing up a town charter for Atkins after a vote to incorporate passed June 8.

Of 428 votes cast at the polls or as absentee, 167 people voted for incorporation and 92 against. The remaining 169 ballots (about 39%) did not have a vote concerning incorporation. Five ballots were spoiled. Home rule passed 174-82, representing 256 total votes.

"They had ballots without any markings at all," said John Evans, attorney for Citizens for Watkins and the election watcher. "But every ballot was counted."

15 YEARS AGO **JUNE 16, 2009**

BRIGHTON — Adams County planning commissioners stated their dislike of a proposed landfill northwest of Bennett; however, proponents of the facility have another chance to have their arguments heard.

Opponents of the Alpine Waste & Recycling facility south of 88th Avenue on Schumacher Road were pleased with the 7-2 vote against the proposal. Those voting against cited neighbors' displeasure with the facility as fueling their decision.

Arguments against the facility include excessive

traffic on local roadways. Dump the Dump has estimated 50 trash trucks would access the facility at its infancy and that the volume would increase. In addition, local aviators and Denver International Airport officials say birds are a threat to aircraft safety.

A spokesman for Alpine said the truck estimate is too high and that the Federal Aviation Administration and Colorado Department of Transportation have studied the site and said it doesn't threaten transportation safety.

10 YEARS AGO **JUNE 17, 2014**

While contested races for the June 24 primary election are small in number, at least one of the battles looks to hold significance to the I-70 Corridor, especially on the Adams County side.

The Republican race for new Adams County Commissioner District 5 features Bennett resident and former town trustee Neal Mancuso against former Brighton mayor Jan Pawlowski. Mancuso is looking to be the first resident of eastern unincorporated Adams County to be commissioner since the late Ted Strickland, who served two terms beginning in 1996.

District 5 was created after county residents in 2012 voted to increase the number of county commissioners from three to five. Unlike Arapahoe County, whose five commissioners are voted by in-district residents only, Adams County commisodor, blowing trash, rats, birds and excess truck sioner races are voted on by residents county-wide.






